

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
IN JOURNALISM/MASS COMMUNICATION
BETWEEN
JAMESTOWN COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
ST. BONAVENTURE UNIVERSITY

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

This document establishes a transfer articulation agreement between Jamestown Community College and St. Bonaventure University. Its purpose is to afford students the opportunity to pre-plan their college careers, and to facilitate the transfer process from the Associate in Science (A.S.) in Communication degree program at Jamestown Community College to the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Journalism/Mass Communication degree program at St. Bonaventure University.

GENERAL GUARANTEE OF ADMISSION AND STANDING

Students who graduate from Jamestown Community College with the A.S. Communication degree are guaranteed acceptance into the B.A. Journalism/Mass Communication degree program at St. Bonaventure University provided they have a minimum Jamestown Community College cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Students who transfer 60 or more credit hours to St. Bonaventure University are guaranteed full junior standing.

GENERAL GUARANTEE OF OPPORTUNITY TO GRADUATE

Students who graduate from Jamestown Community College with at least 39 transferrable credit hours from among the courses listed in Appendix A of this agreement are guaranteed the opportunity to earn the B.A. Journalism/Mass Communication degree with four semesters of normal coursework at St. Bonaventure University.

Students who are admitted to St. Bonaventure University without having earned the A.S. degree but transferring at least 54 Jamestown Community College credit hours from among the courses listed in Appendix A plus Appendix B of this agreement are also guaranteed the opportunity to earn the B.A. Journalism/Mass Communication degree with four semesters of normal coursework at St. Bonaventure University.

Transferred coursework must include CMM 2610 at Jamestown Community College in order to graduate in two years from St. Bonaventure University.

A student may transfer a course in which less than a C was earned only if the cumulative GPA at the time of enrollment is at least 2.5. For students whose cumulative GPA is below 2.5 at the time of enrollment, St. Bonaventure University requires a minimum grade of C for a course to transfer. To earn a baccalaureate degree, students must complete at least 45 undergraduate hours and at least half of the major requirements at St. Bonaventure University.

A separate agreement allows students who are enrolled full-time at Jamestown Community College to take one course free of charge at St. Bonaventure University each semester.

³The School of Journalism and Mass Communication recommends, but does not require, ENG 230 Public Speaking (JCC equivalent course is CMM 1610 Public Speaking) and ENG 221 American Literature II (JCC equivalent course is ENG 2560 American Literature II).

⁴The SBU School of Arts and Sciences requires all majors to complete a foreign language course at the 202 level or higher. Students not prepared to begin at this level will need to take additional courses in the language which count as general electives.
