- Students participating in drop/add procedures during the first week of classes will not be assessed charges for dropped classes required for course schedule changes.
- Students who wish to withdraw from an individual course complete the Individual Course Withdrawal form on the Registrar's Office webpage. Students who wish to withdraw from all of their classes begin the process with the Counseling and Career Center. Students should consult with the financial aid and business offices *before* they stop attending classes or officially submit their withdrawal.
- All refunds are based on the date withdrawal forms are completed and filed with the registrar's office. Exceptions to this policy will be considered
 under extenuating circumstances.
- Students who receive Title IV aid (Pell, SEOG, Direct loans) and withdraw from all classes may have their awards reduced and will be responsible to repay any aid disbursed that they are subsequently ineligible to receive. Refunds are paid in the following order: Federal Direct Loans (subsidized and unsubsidized), PLUS Loans, Pell, SEOG Grants, required refunds of other federal, state, private, or institutional assistance, to the student.
- International students will be charged a fee to ensure they have appropriate health insurance coverage, which includes repatriation. This charge can be removed if the student completes the proof of health insurance waiver process.

CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCE

To be eligible for New York state tuition rates, students must submit a certificate of residence issued by the county in which they reside no earlier than 60 days prior or 30 days after the start of class(es). Without a certificate of residence, the out-of-state tuition rate will be charged. The certificate of residence form and instructions are available at https://www.sunvicc.edu/experience/support/business-office/certificate-residence.

PAYMENT PROCESS FOR ALL STUDENTS

After you have registered for your classes, please visit https://banner.sunyicc.edu. You must first view your bill which completes your financial responsibility agreement before you will be able to view your current semester charges. You are responsible for accessing your bill which is available on demand via Banner self-service account. JCC will not mail you a scheduled bill. If you:

- · Expect financial aid funds that you are eligible to receive, they will be applied to your student account after registration.
- · Need to pay your bill:
 - o You may pay for classes by check or money order at any of the business offices. To pay using a bank account or a credit/debit card, or sign up for the payment plan go online to https://banner.sunyicc.edu.
 - o If payment is not received, your account will be placed on hold and assessed a late fee.

MAINTAINING ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Students enrolled at JCC are eligible to participate in a wide range of federal, state and institutional grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study programs. Students must be accepted and matriculated by the JCC admissions office and meet academic eligibility criteria to receive awarded funds. Start the application process for all sources of aid by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at https://studentaid.gov/. For more information on federal and state financial aid resources, visit the websites for the U.S. Department of Education, Federal Student Aid at www.studentaid.ed.gov, New York State Higher Education Services at www.hesc.ny.gov, and Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency at www.pheaa.org. In addition to meeting financial and academic eligibility requirements, students must meet federal and state citizenship and residency requirements and must not be in default of a federal student loan or owe a repayment of other federal student aid to receive awarded funds.

Students are encouraged to apply for funds from outside sources as well, such as private grants and scholarships, employee reimbursement plans, state vocational rehabilitation programs, Native American aid, veteran's benefits, and workforce development and re-training programs. REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Currently Enrolled Full-Time Students: Student advisement dates can be found on the Advisement page here: www.sunvjcc.edu/advisement. Schedule changes are processed during the drop/add period (dates for each semester are located on page 1). Students can print a copy of their schedule by signing into Banner at https://banner.sunvjcc.edu, or by visiting the Student Services Center on the Cattaraugus or Jamestown Campus or the main office on the North County Center.

New Students and Readmissions: Apply for entrance to the college through the admissions office or at <u>www.sunyjcc.edu.</u> Click on the admissions link. The admissions office will inform you about advisement and registration procedures.

Part-Time Students: Part-time degree-seeking students are encouraged to seek advisement from a full-time faculty member or counselor. Part-time students must follow the placement test policy. If you are a current JCC student and wish to register as a part-time student, please note that you can register through Self-Service Banner. If you are a visiting student, you can register part-time by completing a registration form, available on the Registrar's webpage at https://www.sunvjcc.edu/experience/support/registrar.

Adding a Course: Students who wish to add courses must do so prior to the end of drop/add week and prior to the first class for late starting courses. Any additions after these dates require the instructor's permission. Permission cards are available at the registrar's office on the Jamestown Campus, the Student Services Center on the Cattaraugus County Campus, and the main office of the North County Center. Students may also request permission from instructors, via email, then forward approvals to Reqistrar@mail.sunyicc.edu immediately if permission to join the course is granted. Students who wish to add courses must do so before the end of the drop/add period. Students are strongly encouraged to connect with instructors for courses that have already started to obtain course information. Full-time students can make changes to their schedule through SSB by using their alternative PIN, obtained during advisement.

Viewing Your Bill - Financial Responsibility Agreement (FRA): Registering for classes creates a financial obligation to the college. Registered students are required to view their bill and acknowledge their charges. If this is not completed it will result in the student being dropped from all registered classes. You can view your bill by logging in to self-service Banner at https://banner.sunvjcc.edu. If you are under 18, an electronic e-sign form must be completed by you AND a parent e-mail signature is also required. You can find the form to complete on the JCC website here: https://www.sunvjcc.edu/support/financial-aid-billing/bill. Complete the form electronically by the due date.

Paying Your Bill: Once registered, students may access their bill online immediately after registration. To ensure class registration is not cancelled, each student must view their bill agreement. Student bills may be paid online in full or in installments at http://mycollegepaymentplan.com/Jamestown. If payment is not received, your account will be placed on hold and assessed a late fee.

Withdrawing From a Course(s): Visit https://www.sunvjcc.edu/programs/academic-resources for semester specific withdrawal deadlines. Students must discuss withdrawing from a course with their instructor and advisor, then complete the Individual Course Withdrawal Form, available on the registrar's webpage at sunvjcc.edu/support/registrar/total-withdrawal and begin the process with the Counseling and Career Center. Please refer to withdrawal dates and liability on page 4. Withdrawals beginning after the first day of the semester will result in liability of your tuition and fees.

ADVISEMENT NOTES

- Full-time students are required to see their advisors to review their academic progress and to discuss courses for the upcoming semester.
 Part-time students are also strongly urged to seek advisement.
- When you meet with your advisor, review your educational-vocational plans and academic progress. Discuss degree and graduation
 requirements. It is ultimately the student's responsibility to learn and know the graduation and program requirements for the degree being
 sought and to monitor progress toward fulfilling those requirements.

PLACEMENT TEST INFORMATION

Math and English placement is based on high school GPA and additional success indicators. This helps determine the courses in which the student is best prepared to begin. Students without a GPA through the junior year of high school will take a computer-based math and reading test. Students wishing to challenge their English or math placement may choose to take the English and/or math placement test.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Additional Grades: Consult the college catalog for details about the incomplete (I), credit (CR), audit (AU), special audit (SA, SW, SX), official withdrawal (W), and administrative withdrawal (X) grades.

Imputed Credit: The faculty and administration have determined that some courses listed in this master schedule may not be counted toward degree programs offered by the college. These are courses which are not at the college level, but are designed as remedial courses for students who need to prepare themselves for college-level work. Eligible students enrolled in courses carrying imputed credit may receive financial aid.

Attendance: Every student is expected to attend all lecture and laboratory sessions for which they are registered. Absences will be recorded by instructors, and the student will be held responsible for making up all work missed. Attendance requirements for each course are established by the instructor and announced, published, and distributed with the course outline at the first class meeting.

Participation in Online Courses: Online students must begin their course the week it is scheduled to begin. Students are expected to log in to their course three-four times per week. Participation requirements are set by the instructor and published in course information documents. More information is available at www.sunvicc.edu/academics/online-learning.

Retention and Graduation Rates: A study of the 700 students who enrolled as first-time full-time students at JCC in fall 2018 indicated that 35% had graduated by the beginning of the fall 2021 semester. An additional 13% had transferred to other colleges prior to graduation and 6% were still enrolled. A recent survey of 2020 graduates indicated that 41% of those responding had transferred to four-year colleges or universities and 44% were employed full time. (Sources: Materials from Jamestown Community College Office of Institutional Research and the 2019-2020 graduate follow-up survey). It should be noted that some students "stop out" for a semester or two due to family, work, or financial considerations, but eventually return to complete their educational programs. Some students leave college before receiving their degrees because they have obtained the necessary skills for employment or have otherwise met their educational goals by attending JCC. COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students who have completed pre-/corequisites with a passing grade at another institution must provide a copy of their unofficial transcript at the time of registration. Terms usedin course requirement information in the master schedule:

- PREREQUISITE: A course or other requirement that must be completed prior to enrolling in another course.
- COREQUISITE: A course or other requirement that must be completed during the same semester as another course.
- **ELIGIBILITY:** Refers to an academic readiness to take certain courses through successful completion of previous coursework or placement testing.
- PERMISSION OF INSTRUCTOR: A course with this notation requires the student to meet with the instructor to receive permission to take the course

WAIVER OF PRE-/COREQUISITES: If a student feels qualified to take a course for which he or she does not appear to have the formal requisite background, the student should contact the instructor of the course. If, in the estimation of the instructor, the student meets the requisites in some other way, the instructor may sign an instructor's permission card which the student can then present to the Registrar's Office on the Jamestown Campus, the Student Services Center on the Cattaraugus County Campus, or the Main Office on the Dunkirk Campus. In the absence of the instructor, the waiver may be signed by the discipline coordinator/director, or dean. The Registrar's office will also accept requisite waivers and special permission to register for specific courses via email at Registrar@mail.sunvicc.edu, provided proof that the appropriate permission is received. Students cannot register for courses for which they do not have a pre/Corequisite, a signed waiver form, or an email permitting registration.

SPECIAL STATEMENT REGARDING SEQUENTIAL COURSEWORK: In the case of sequential coursework (i.e. math and English) where the student's entry point may be determined by way of a placement procedure or successful completion of other coursework in the sequence, a student will have met a prerequisite or corequisite for a course in the sequence if they are eligible to register for a higher level course for which the current course is a prerequisite. That is, if a student is eligible to take course Cina sequence (where course A is a prerequisite for course B, and course B is a prerequisite for course C), the student has met pre- or corequisites for both course A and course B.

ONLINE COURSES

As noted above, JCC offers online courses in asynchronous, synchronous, and hybrid modes. Familiarize yourself with the mode options or consult your advisor prior to selecting courses.

BEFORE CHOOSING AN ONLINE COURSE

- You must have a reliable Internet connection, computer access, and a valid email address. High speed access is highly recommended, but not required. Mobile devices are not recommended as the primary means to take an online course.
- Online courses rely heavily on reading, writing, and engaging in online discussions.

HOW DOES ASYNCHRONOUS ONLINE LEARNING WORK?

Courses foliowa regular semester schedule with assignments due each week. Courses have specific starting and ending dates which must be followed. JCC recommends that you log in and participate 3-4 times a week to complete assignments and activities, as well as interact with your professor and classmates. During the week, you log in on days and times convenient to you. You participate in the course by reading the required textbooks and online material, asking questions, posting discussion responses, submitting assignments, or taking quizzes as required by each professor. Textbooks are required and can be purchased from the college store web store: https://sunyicc.bncollege.com at least one week prior to class start date. Your professor posts information that explains requirements, expectations, the course schedule, and how you are evaluated.

SUNY GENERAL EDUCATION

SUNY General Education (GE) is a system-wide framework applicable to all SUNY undergraduate degree programs that addresses the fundamental goals of higher education, including proficiency with essential skills, familiarization with disciplinary and interdisciplinary ways of knowing, and enhancement of the values and disposition of an engaged 21st century global citizenry.

The SUNY GE framework includes ten specific "knowledge and skills areas" and two general "core competencies." Each of the components addresses distinct learning outcomes. In addition to promoting academic excellence, the overall structure supports seamless transfer of students between and among SUNY institutions.

HONORS PROGRAM

JCC's Honors Program provides challenging curriculum, supportive services, and special enrichment opportunities for highly motivated students who have demonstrated their academic ability. Honors students enroll in special honors-designated courses, engage in co-curricular activities, and complete projects that synthesize academic and real-world experiences. Students who complete the honors program requirements receive an honors citation on their transcripts along with other special graduation recognition and student privileges.

Honors courses are developed by faculty who are dedicated to providing additional rigor and support for honors students. The courses must have the following attributes: a focus on greater depth and breadth of subject matter; an interdisciplinary approach; strong attention to writing and critical thinking; and a strong focus on values and ethics.

New students with a 90% high school average who are eligible for MAT 1540 are eligible for the Honors Program. Returning students who are eligible to take a college-level English without support courses and MAT 1540 and have a GPA of 3.5 or better after 12 credit hours are honors eligible.

To earn JCC's honors citation students must successfully complete a three-credit hour honors symposium course as well as two one-credit hour honors project courses. The symposium course allows students to approach a global topic from diverse perspectives.

Honors students are required to successfully complete two one-credit, **project-based honors courses** which are related to courses in which they are currently enrolled or have recently completed. Each project must include some form of applied learning: fieldwork, internship, service learning, innovative/ creative project, and/or undergraduate research. After registering, you will be guided by the honors program coordinator and your advisor to identify a course to which to link the project. Students then work directly with faculty members to design projects that fit their interests and goals. 3543 ANT 7514 3 Honors Symposium: Waste & Want - Global Food Systems Bessette, S Asynchronous Online 1/22 5/16

Course Description:

Students will understand how food is one of our most basic needs, but few of us think about how food is produced, where in the world it comes from, or how it must travel to get to us. This course will help students understand social, political and economic processes such as colonization, industrialization, and corporatization, and how they laid the foundation for the current global food system. Students will also engage with ongoing, contemporary concerns such as the relationship between agriculture and the environment, food waste, labor practices, food aid, and how race, class, gender, and nationality impact our experience of food systems. Throughout the course, we'll look at how people resist and reshape food systems, and how we can find alternatives that do more to protect people and the environment.

IMMUNIZATION & MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE INFORMATION

According to New York State Public Health Law (NYS PHL) §2167, JCC is required to maintain a record of the following for each student: A response to receipt of meningococcal disease and vaccine information signed by the student or student's parent or guardian. This must include information on the availability of meningococcal meningitis vaccine and either 1) a record of meningococcal meningitis immunization within the past 5 years, or 2) an acknowledgement of meningococcal disease risks and refusal of meningococcal meningitis immunization signed by the student or student's parent or quardian.

Complete JCC's Certificate of Immunization/Acknowledgement of Meningitis Information form, available at the JCC health center on the campus you are attending or downloaded from www.sunyicc.edu. According to New York State Public Health Law, no institution shall permit any student to attend the institution in excess of 30 days without complying with this law. The cost of the vaccine may be covered by the individual's health insurance policy.

To learn more about meningitis and the vaccine, contact the JCC health center and/or your physician. Additional information about the disease is available at the New York State Health Department (www.nealth.state.ny.us), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) (www.cdc.gov/ncidod/dbmd/diseaseinfo), and the American College Health Association (ACHA) (www.acha.org).

Students bom on or after January 1, 1957: New York State Public Health Law 2165 requires post-secondary students attending colleges and universities to demonstrate proof of immunity to measles, mumps, and rubella. This law applies to anyone born January 1, 1957 or later who is taking six or more semester hours. Failure to do so will result in suspension and a \$25 fine.

Acknowledgement of Meningitis Information form should be signed by a physician, unless you are attaching other legal proofs such as school records or county clinic records. For questions regarding immunizations, contact the campus health center at the site you are attending:

INQUIRE COURSES

Things in the real world don't often fit inside the neat boxes of academic subjects. Why should all of your classes?

Inquiry courses explore compelling questions from fresh angles, bringing together different disciplines, perspectives, and types of evidence. Designed for first-year students, they also help you navigate the ins and outs of college and are required for all new students entering degree programs.

CRN 3553 Inquire: The Art of Adulting

What does it mean to be an adult? That depends on where you live and who you ask. Even Google won't provide an easy answer. The concept of adulthood has changed over time, which can make responsible adulting seem like a moving target. This course will explore some fundamentals of coming of age such as career and educational planning, budgets, financial planning, managing a household, taking care of your mental and physical health, and being an engaged citizen. We'll seek to answer timeless questions such as "How am I going to pay forthat?" while identifying tools and resources that students can use to make a plan to win at adulting.

CRN 3536 Inquire: Art of Mathematics

Mathematics and art have long been intertwined. From sacred geometric symbols dating back thousands of years to modern-day mathematicians using crochet to visualize complicated topological spaces, mathematics has bred creative endeavors, and many creative endeavors have their foundation in mathematics. In this course we will investigate those connections through topics such as how to "weave" an invisible carpet; why engineers find origami useful; and what daisies, the irrational number phi, and Leonardo Da Vinci have in common. Students will also discover their own connections as they exercise their creative talents. No special mathematics skills are required beyond curiosity and an open mind!

CRN 3554 Inquire: Artificial Intelligence

"Hey SIRI, what will my career area look like in 5, 10, and 20 years?" The continual development, refinement, and implementation of artificial intelligence (AI) is a disruptive force increasingly impacting virtually every career area. In many cases, its implementation is increasing the speed and efficiency of systems (e.g. fraud detection in banking), but in others the impact can potentially have more damaging effects (e.g. the impact of autonomous vehicles on employment in the trucking industry). Through an exploration of AI past, present, and future, students will consider various forms of artificial intelligence, how the application of AI impacts society in general, and more specifically AI's potential impact on their individual choice of careers.

CRN 3689 Inquire: The Black Experience

This course is an introductory course, offering an overview of major themes, issues, and concentrations in African American Studies. In order to explore the complexities and the richness of the African American experience students will engage with written texts, film, art, music, and literature. This course is intended to provide a foundation in African American Studies that sparks students' curiosity and encourages them to explore the topic further.

CRN 3685 Inquire: Cursive, Curse or Craft?

Is there any point to knowing how to read and write in cursive handwriting? Since required cursive instruction has been retired from most of our elementary schools, do you say "good riddance," or do you think that the skill is a craft - perhaps an expressive art form — worth preserving? Today, a vast number of young adults can neither read it nor write with it. Using open resource teaching tools and simple writing supplies, students will receive instruction in cursive and develop the ability to read, or "translate," it when encountered in academics and in life. In addition, we will explore differing points of view from a variety of educators, psychologists, journalists, and artists as to the place of cursive in contemporary discourse.

CRN 3535 Inquire: Dark Side of Tourism

What makes Dark Tourism so attractive, and why are humans fascinated by these gloomy and horrifying places? Thanatourism, or Dark Tourism, is an extreme and alternative form of tourism as well as a growing and curious part of the industry. This course explores the diverse forms of Dark Tourism and the motivation to visit sites that are associated with death, disaster, destruction, and the macabre. In this course, students study the impacts of such tourism on culture, economies, the environment, and the ethics involved. Students will also apply theoretical knowledge to create their own niche product for a specific Dark Tourism market or research project.

CRN 3557 Inquire: Digital Citizenship

If an employer were to conduct an online search, what would your digital profile reveal? Can ethics and civility be demonstrated in the online environment? How can you protect yourself and your digital identity? This course will explore these questions as students take a deeper look into the role technology plays in their lives and what it means to be a digital citizen. In this course, students will explore their social media use and examine the potential effects as aspiring professionals. In addition, students will create an electronic portfolio they will use to collect and curate their digital archives from their academic lives as they transition to the professional workplace.

CRN 3724 Inquire S.E.: Early Black Cinema

Early Black Cinema: Students will study independent movies made for segregated theaters from the 1920s into the 1940s. Through research, discussion and video creation, we will strive to identify with the audiences of "Race Cinema": Black-cast movies which confronted such issues as the color line, Jim Crow, the few allowed role models, Blackface minstrelsy, the Harlem Renaissance, and northern migration.

CRN 3544 Inquire: Food for Thought

In what ways do our kitchens inform us about our world? Each week we'll come together virtually to cook a meal in our own kitchens while seeking to answer this question and expanding our palates. Some weeks will feature experts in different disciplines to understand how the world comes together around the kitchen table. Students will be expected to write a weekly blog that shares their cooking experience and chronicles the stories of their kitchen. Access to a kitchen (stove, oven, and sink) during class meeting times is required; pantry staples and cookware can be provided by the instructor.

CRN 3687 Inquire: Gamers Guide to Galaxy

Gaming is like any life journey, especially in the academy: When students enter college, they are presented with open worlds; they are expected to develop new skill sets that "level them up" in order to look back upon where they've been and set themselves for the future. After repeating that mission over and over again, students become skilled as they become academic masters. Featuring the virtual worlds of Among Us and Minecraft with special guests: Evony: TKR, Dungeons and Dragons, and the married couples of the Game of Life.

CRN 3555 Inquire: Immigrant Voices

This course will focus on the experiences of migrants in the world today. Through stories and personal interviews students will examine and compare the thoughts, challenges, perspectives, and journeys of migrants. Students will answer the questions: Why do people leave their homes? What are the impacts and challenges for them, the communities they leave and those that receive them? Through community outreach, students will come to know immigrants living in our area and will capture their stories as part of a digital storytelling project.

CRN 3722 Inquire S.E.: In Our Blood

This is a course about identity - specifically, the part of our identities rooted in genetics. Companies like Ancestry.com make it easy today to uncover where we came from. But how important is this genetic information to our sense of ourselves as individuals? And what meaning does it have for us in the 21st century? For most of human history, ancestry has been a tool of the rich and powerful, justifying their position on the top of society while holding others down. In the United States, one drop of African blood was enough to enslave millions of people. Can ancestry mean something different now? We'll ground our search in the basics of genealogy and heredity before moving on to consider the various factors that shape identity and belonging. There will also be ample opportunity for self-discovery and reflection. You'll track down some of your own ancestors and bring their stories to life in an eScrapbook.

CRN 3556 Inquire: In the News

Do your instructors ever bring up topics in class that are in the news, but you don't have any knowledge about? Is your response, "I think I have heard about it, but I am not sure?" News is available through a lot of different mediums, but do you actually pay attention to or take advantage of what is available? We will discover together newsworthy events of local, national, and global concern while discerning appropriate sources for them. No "fake news" here. Students will follow their own topic of interest throughout the course and share their findings with the class each week and in a final project. Get ready to learn about what is going on all around us.

CRN 3548, 3549 Inquire: Let's Go Globe-Trotting

Do you dream of seeing the world, or even just one special country someday? In this course you will learn howto research and plan for a successful trip to the country of your dreams that will stay dearto your heart forever. You will learn to ask all the right questions to make you an informed and safe globe trotter, while learning about interesting and diverse cultures around the world. The final project is a colorful travel booklet you create with several complete, informative itineraries to various countries that could be transformed into real trips someday with only minor changes (such as flights & cost)!

CRN 3558 Inquire: Let's Play Fair: Advancing Equity & Inclusion in Sports

How does the sport industry drive our culture today, and can sports be a catalyst for social change? This course will examine the current and historical influence of the sport industry on American society. Students will examine what diversity, equity, and inclusion mean in the American sport industry through examination of race, ethnicity, sex, gender, and sexual orientation. They will also take a critical look at management practices. The sport industry has a disconnect between the individuals who play and work versus those that lead and own. Sports have always been a proponent of playing fair and following the rules. But if that's the case, those who run the leagues must also play fair

CRN 3551 Inquire: Local Foods, Local Places

In this course, students will engage in hands-on activities that examine the local and regional food system, including community gardens and urban farms, the local farmers markets, and organizations such as soup kitchen and food pantries. We'll take a look at how food is grown and distributed throughout the region, and students will have the opportunity to grow and preserve their own food.

CRN 3543 Inquire: Local Legends

Legends can play a powerful role in shaping a community's culture and identity. But sometimes they are more fiction than fact. How do untruths arise and why do they get passed on? To what effect? From ancient earthworks to Underground Railroad hideaways, religious radicalism to sensational murders, this course will uncover the facts and falsehoods behind some of our area's most intriguing legends and explore their significance today. We will go on at least one off-site field trip and sleuth out a variety of first-hand sources to find the true stories behind the myths. We will combine our findings to create a program or exhibit that can be shared with the community.

CRN 3537, 3538, 3539, 3540 Inquire: Music Is: Love, Death, Spirit

Frank Fitzpatrick, a critically acclaimed songwriter, astutely describes music as "essential to human life and an integral part of our development as individuals and as a species." Every culture has always had music. Since love, death, and spirituality are also essential to our existence, it's not surprising that more songs likely have been sung about those three topics than any others. How does music help us to celebrate love, come to terms with death, and connect in spirit with something larger than ourselves? How does music about these topics add to our human experience, enabling usto discover deeper truths about ourselves? The class will examine these and other questions relating to music of various styles, time periods, genres, and student interests. Students will develop related questions as they explore and interpret music of their own choosing. Music listening, discussion of multiple perspectives and meanings, personal reflection, and some research will be important components of our inquiry. No prior experience with music is required for this course, and it welcomes students of all majors.

CRN 3538 Inquire: Outbreak

This course will examine the evolution of and emergence of infectious disease. We will incorporate information from biology, anthropology, and public health. We will pay particular attention to the ethical issues raised by the health campaigns used to battle emerging disease around the world, which include public perceptions, politics, and the stigma that can result. Students will work on a simulation to "contain" a local outbreak.

CRN 3547 Inquire: Personality of Politics

This course helps students understand the psychological origins and evolution of their own political views—specifically, conservativism and liberalism. After exploring partisan politics on a theoretical level, students will research their own "political genealogy." They will think about all the potential sources of their views and interview individuals with both similar and opposite views to their own. The course will also explore the current state of political discourse in the United States and current movements to censure unpopular opinions. What role does political correctness play in our current political climate? How do the 24-hour news cycle and social media contribute to group polarization? The roots of extremism on both the right and left will be explored. Students will develop recommendations for how to improve political discourse in our world today.

CRN 3559 Inquire: Race to Wellness

This course will explore an understanding of the broader health issues facing our current society. We will explore a range of topics associated with health, such as: population growth, food security, affordable healthcare, environmental disease (cancer), emerging diseases (virus outbreaks), food-borne illness, hazardous waste, and human health risk assessments. As a semester project, students will choose a current health issue and create a public service announcement that represents the problem, focusing on possible interventions and solutions.

CRN 3715 Inquire S.E.: Redefining Feminism

Don't be afraid to say the "F" word; feminism, that is. This course seeks to explore the roots and meaning of feminism and feminisms. Through participatory learning, collaborative projects, critical thinking, and creative expression, students will engage with differences that cut across race, gender identities, class, and national origin. This course will stress the role of students as active co-producers of knowledge and it will require students to participate in in-class discussions, written work, and project-based learning. Students will engage with sources ranging from graphic novels, social media, journal articles, and readings from various sources. Additionally, students will be required to complete a creative final project that integrates research with campus life.

CRN 3552, 3546 Inquire: Robot Revolution?

Advanced manufacturing technologies such as additive manufacturing, machine learning, robotics and others continue to grow in importance in manufacturing. The role for humans in industry will continue to change as well as a result of those technological changes. Students will explore the social, cultural, and very personal changes that are likely to occur as manufacturing becomes more highly automated. A battle plan will be developed to stay relevant and highly employable in the face of those changes.

CRN 3534 Inquire: Silent Women

100 years ago in the US, the movies were being invented with technology that was only some two decades old and evolving. This is the time of the suffragist and the 19th Amendment, the flapper, Prohibition, speakeasies, and bathtub gin. The movies grow up in these years, still silent until 1929, and according to film historians, more women are involved in writing, producing, and directing these movies than there have ever been since. In this course studentswill study the movies circa 1905-1929, the times they sprang from, and the women who created them. To better understand the process, students will create their own silent movie scene and decide who deserves the pre-1929 Academy Awards.

CRN 3542 Inquire: Tabletop Extravaganza

Students will explore the history of gaming across cultures as a lens for examining the potential of games as mediators for social engagement, community cohesion, and individual growth. Students will play a variety of historical and modern tabletop games designed to encourage prosocial engagement and critical thought through cooperative gameplay and problem solving. The selected gameswill also expose students to various game mechanicsand design. Based on research, course readings, and hands-on gameplay, students will collaborate to create and demonstrate gameplay for a tabletop game of their own design, ultimately answering the question: How do games make us better?

CRN 3725 Inquire S.E.: The Urban Divide

What is urban development, and what impact does it have on communities around the world? Students will explore what it means to live in a neighborhood, and who gets to decide what neighborhoods need to be "renewed." Students will also focus on how neighborhoods may be impacted by factors such as food security, disasters, and pollution. Finally, students will analyze a neighborhood and design ways to make neighborhoods more livable in the future.

CRN 3541,3686 Inquire: Urban Legends

All of us have heard stories that have been passed down from our friends. Sometimes, these are ghost stories, such as the vanishing hitchhiker story about a young woman who finds a ride with a sympathetic driver only to disappear. Sometimes, these stories involve alligators in city sewers or dangers in college dorms. Called urban legends, these stories are set in contemporary cultures and often reflect concerns and imagined dangers of specific time periods. In this course, studentswill examine various urban legends to determine their overall significances, meaningsand perceived moral lessons.

CRN 3562, 3690, Inquire: Wellness and Happiness

If you ask people what they want in the future, health/wellness and happiness are often high on the list. College students want a future career and relationships that bring them meaning and happiness. What exactly are we envisioning when we set our sights on a happy future? How does wellness intertwine with happiness and how can we use writing to investigate these topics? In this course, we will examine the lessons gleaned from the scientific study of happiness and well-being. Students will identify factors that make happy individuals and societies and will explore how to increase their personal wellness and happiness. Special attention will be paid to the multi-dimensional wellness model, happiness, gratitude, and positive well-being.

CRN 3550, 3560 Inquire: What Makes Us Human?

What does it mean to be human? Using an interdisciplinary, collaborative and active approach, students will explore the unique characteristics that make us human. Throughout history, numerous attempts have been made to define humanity including capacity for learning, communication, music, religion, creativity and curiosity. As the pursuit for a concise definition progresses, and scientific inquiry advances, we have become more cognizant of the I and all dependent upon a careful balance of our ecosystem. Throughout the course, students will have the opportunity to investigate the uniqueness of the human species, as well as develop an understanding of its precarious balance on Earth.

CRN 3561 Inquire: What Would Florence Nightingale Say?

Florence Nightingale has always been acclaimed as the founder of modern nursing. This journey in time will start at the beginning, researching the common medical practices of Florence's time. From there we will travel forward through history, identifying advances that have changed medical practices as Florence once knew. We will debate those changes and the positive and/or negative outcomes that have resulted. Our journey will end with a glimpse into the future and with what we propose medical practices might be. Along the way we will pause often to ask ourselves: What would Florence Nightingale say?

CRN 3545 Inquire: Where Do I Start?

Every decision has a consequence. Some decisions are so easy that you're not even aware you are making them. Others are complicated with many factors to consider, some of which may be beyond our control or shaped by the society we live in. Traditional college age students face significant life decisions such as selecting a career pathway, living with parents or on their own, beginning or ending a romantic relationship. Older students may face decisions related to a career change, marriage, and childrearing. If you are facing an important life decision - this course is for you!
