JCC Receives Recognition from Online Ranking Websites for Affordable, Quality Education

From Cybersecurity to Nursing, JCC gained recognition from several online college ranking websites throughout the 2021-2022 academic year. The ranking system is gaining relevance in higher education as it highlights quality and achievements, thus helping to paint a more vivid picture of the colleges featured and increasing their visibility and prestige. Each site has their own methodology to assess colleges and their programs. All intend to make it easier for students to make informed decisions as they make the leap into higher education.

[Intelligent.com](#) recognized the college for Best Online Associate in Computer Science and Information Technology and Systems programs, Best Online Computer Science Programs, Best Online Military-Friendly Colleges and Best Community Colleges in New York. The college is noted for flexible distance learning that appeals to busy adults, and hybrid models that include on-campus and online formats. Researchers compared 704 programs from 2,900 universities and colleges across the United States.

University HQ listed JCC in its list of [Best Associate Degrees in New York](#). The site has developed rankings for more than 4,000 schools. Among the criteria considered in the ranking system are flexible schedules for working professionals and traditional campus life for high school graduates.

University HQ also had [praise for the college's Cybersecurity program](#), which was named one of the nation's best online associate degree offerings in 2022. JCC's program came in at 36 in University HQ's rankings of 50 U.S. colleges.

Best Value Schools placed JCC 11th in the nation in their 2021 rankings of [Best Online Certifications in Information Technology](#). They described JCC's program as a well-rounded option that will help students prepare for a wide variety of roles in IT.

Rounding out the list of accolades, the college's [nursing program was ranked](#) among the best associate degree offerings in New York state in 2021 per the Nursing Schools Almanac annual rankings. Rankings are determined by student performance on the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses. The degree came in at 25 of 68 programs evaluated. The Nursing Schools Almanac uses 10 years of data to calculate the pass rate among first-time test-takers at each institution.

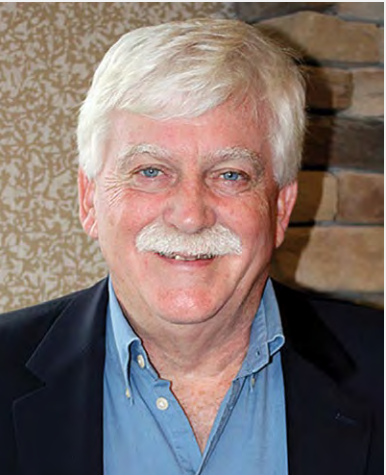

Administration Spotlight: NELSON GARIFI >>

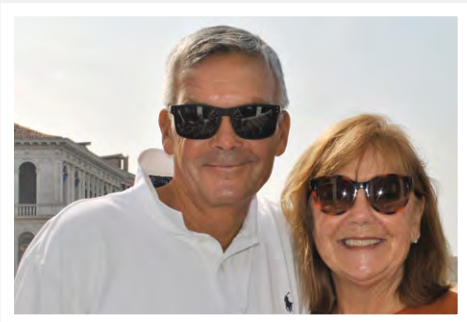

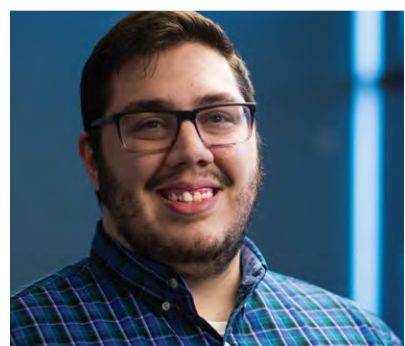

Student Spotlight: YORDANGEL GONZALEZ >>

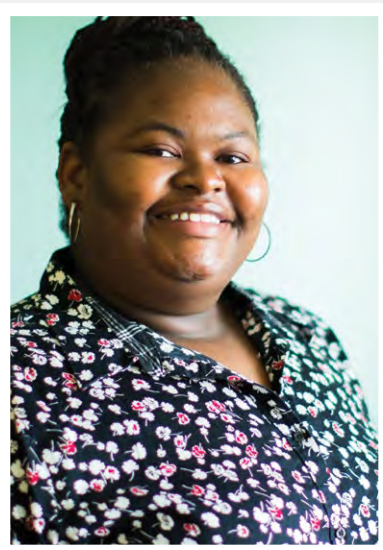

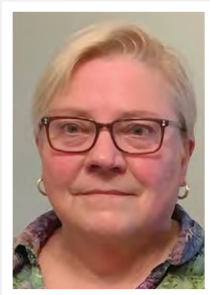

Johnson has been with the college for more than 20 years, beginning as part-time Health Center assistant and earning promotion to her current position in 2005.

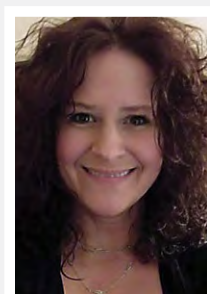


EXCELLENCE IN PROFESSIONAL SERVICE Jody Perrin, director of Marketing and Communications

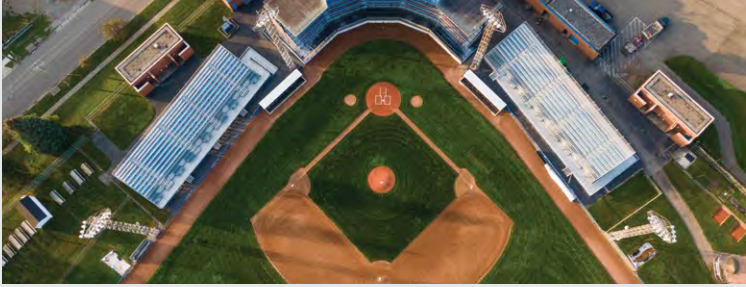
