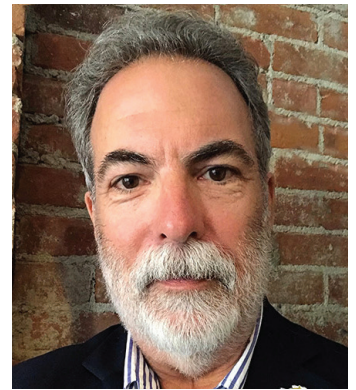

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

CELEBRATING 75 YEARS OF JCC

The year 2025 marked a significant milestone for Jamestown Community College with its 75th anniversary.

The celebration kicked off in May with the 75th commencement ceremonies, which offered a meaningful reflection on JCC’s history. Marilyn Zagora, the recently retired vice president of Academic Affairs and a 50-year employee, spoke about the college’s core value of embracing change, from its post-World War II origins to its expansion into new communities, the introduction of online programs, and its growing support for learners of all backgrounds.

“Our goal has been to prepare you not only to embrace the inevitable change you will encounter in life with confidence and enthusiasm, but also to be the architects of positive and meaningful change in your chosen professions, in your communities, and in your personal lives,” Zagora told the new graduates.

JCC was officially chartered by the State University of New York on Feb. 7, 1950, and was the first locally sponsored SUNY public community college to award a degree. JCC is now one of 30 community colleges within the 64-member SUNY system with over 30,000 graduates.

JCC began by holding afternoon classes at Jamestown High School before opening its first campus in the former Goodwill home in 1954. Continued growth led to new facilities, including the donation of the East Jamestown Elementary School property in 1959 and the move to JCC’s current 107-acre Jamestown campus in 1962. The college expanded its regional footprint in 1976 with the launch of the Olean campus, which later moved downtown and underwent major improvements in the early 2000s. JCC has also served students through locations in Dunkirk and Warren.

JCC hosted a 75th anniversary community fair in August 2025 and an alumni weekend gathering in Jamestown that drew dozens of graduates in September. In November, the JCC Foundation’s annual awards gala included a toast to 75 years by longtime former employee Nelson Garifi and honored a group of 10 college retirees who remain committed to supporting JCC.

JCC’s 75th anniversary reflects where the college has been, where it is now, and where it is going. It is also a celebration of the people who have made JCC a vibrant, welcoming community.

September 2024

Kubiak Prepared for Academic Affairs VP Role

The job titles she has held at JCC can fill an entire page on a resume: everything from coordinator of Experiential Learning – where Jessica Kubiak started in 2010 – to director, dean, consultant, and associate vice president. She was appointed vice president of Academic Affairs in May 2024 after serving in an interim role for a semester.

JCC Welcomes Therapy Dog to Cattaraugus County Campus

JCC welcomed Bodie, a certified therapy doodle, to the Cattaraugus County Campus. Spending time in the Learning Commons, Bodie helps students reduce stress, improve focus, and feel supported during studying and exams - reflecting the college's ongoing commitment to student mental health and wellness.



October 2024

Workforce Development Hatching Entrepreneurship Program Kicks Off First Cohort

The Hatch at JCC started its first entrepreneurship program on the Cattaraugus County Campus. The Hatching Entrepreneurship Program: Where Innovations Takes Flight is an eight-week program for entrepreneurs and small business owners in the Olean area.

JCC YMCA Early Learning Center Opens with Ribbon Cutting

An opening ceremony and ribbon

cutting was held for the new childcare center on the Cattaraugus County Campus. Open since August, the JCC YMCA Early Learning Center is run and staffed by the YMCA of the Twin Tiers.



Pop-Up Medical Clinic on Jamestown Campus Provides Free Care for 249 Patients

A Remote Area Medical clinic brought life-changing health services to the Southern Tier West region. Over the two-day clinic at the Jamestown Campus, 409 medical, dental, and vision services with a value over \$205,000 were provided to 249 patients at no cost. JCC served as the clinic's community host group, spearheading the planning, fundraising, coordination and operation of the clinic.



JCC and SUNY Fredonia Forge Stronger Partnership to Improve Student Transition to Four-Year Degree Completion

The presidents of both schools signed the Preferred Partnership Agreement that solidifies a favored relationship between the two campuses. Fredonia pledged that JCC graduates who transfer to Fredonia will receive preferred benefits relative to the admissions process, transfer credit considerations, course registration and engagement experiences.

Hatch Business Incubator Wins \$25K Springboard Award

The Hatch Business Incubator at JCC was one of eight organizations awarded a total of \$200,000 in the final round of Springboard, a new regional, innovative rapid prize competition that aims to support those contributing to and expanding the entrepreneurial ecosystem in Buffalo, Rochester and Southern Tier communities.

November 2024

Ten Graduates Honored at Alumni Association Awards Gala

Michael Pease, Vernon Robinson, and Lionel Wescott, Sr. were recipients of the Distinguished Alumnus Award. The Foundation also honored alumni award recipients from each of the college's six career communities, including Rebecca Allen, Timothy Hollamby, Darla Kent, Daniel Leake, Nikki Pierce, and Alizé Scott-Nowell.

John M. LaMancuso Named John D. Hamilton Award Honoree

A 1973 JCC graduate, LaMancuso began his private practice in internal medicine in Jamestown in 1982 and continues to serve as active medical staff in the department of medicine at UPMC Chautauqua. LaMancuso also supports the community in a number of capacities, including serving on many committees.



JCC Approved to Offer Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor Certification

JCC's Workforce Development staff and Addictions Counseling faculty worked together to help bring this necessary training to the college. Those working in the addictions counseling field are required to earn CASAC certification through the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports.

December 2024

Nursing Graduates Earn High Pass Rate on National Exam

The class of 2024 Nursing program graduates achieved a 95% pass rate on the National Council Licensure Examination. JCC graduates achieved better exam results than their peers around the country and state. The national pass rate for all nursing programs was 89.19%, and the pass rate for New York state nursing programs was 88.88%

Bench Dedication Held for Longtime Administrator and Faculty Member

Marilyn Zagora's more than 40 years of contributions to the college were recognized with a bench dedication to the former faculty member and administrator. The wood bench, etched with her name, was unveiled in the lobby of Hamilton Collegiate Center during a campus gathering and celebration of Zagora, who retired as Academic Affairs vice president.



January 2025

Professor Named SUNY Accessibility Fellow

Chancellor John B. King Jr. announced Shannon Bessette, professor of Anthropology, as one of 11 inaugural fellows across the SUNY system to be chosen to join the cohort, which brings together a community of faculty leaders and champions committed to promoting and growing accessibility practices on their campuses.

JCC Earns SUNY Online+ Recertification

Eleven of JCC's degree and certificate programs were approved for SUNY's Online+ recertification. Online programs that are part of SUNY Online+ provide additional support services for students and faculty. SUNY noted that JCC "has a high level of institutional commitment to high

quality online education, and your best practices for administering online programs are exemplary."

Bentley Appointed Foundation Executive Director

Carissa Bentley, who replaces the retired Maria Kindberg, was JCC's Development and Alumni Relations coordinator since 2022. She joined the Foundation in 2017 and has served in various capacities for the Foundation and the college.

February 2025

Construction Technology Program Launched in Partnership with Builders Exchange of the Southern Tier

This 350-hour training gives students jobsite training and the opportunity to earn industry certifications and credentials. Thanks to grant funding from the City of Jamestown and in partnership with The Builders Exchange of the Southern Tier, the \$100 cost of this program is offered at a reduced rate.

March 2025

New Hatch Cafe Opens on Cattaraugus County Campus

Visitors to the cafe located in the College Center were greeted with green, gold, and white balloons at the entrance, homey decor and furniture inside, and the familiar flavorful coffees, desserts, soups, and charcuteries of the former La Dolce Vita that once operated down the street in downtown Olean.



Economic Impact Study Shows JCC as a Catalyst for Regional Growth and Societal Well-Being

The independent study highlighted how JCC enhanced the college's service area in New York and Pennsylvania during the 2022-23 fiscal year by supporting local industries, students, taxpayers, and society overall.

April 2025

JCC Awards Life Credit, Certificate to Former 87-Year-Old Student

Paul Jewett, who earned 46 college credits during the 1980s at JCC, was awarded a certificate from during a gathering of friends and family at Eden Heights. At 87, Jewett is the oldest known student to earn a credential from JCC.



Staff Member Honored for Excellence in Instructional Support

Laura Parmenter was honored with the Faculty Advisory Council on Teaching and Technology Excellence in Instructional Support award for community colleges by the State University of New York. Parmenter is JCC's director of Online Learning and interim director of the Learning Commons, which provides students with access to library services, tutoring help, and accessibility support.

May 2025

Two Students Recipients of Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence

Abigail Hill and Ayomideji Israel-Akinbo were JCC's 2025 recipients of the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence. They, along with more than 200 students across the State University of New York system, were recognized during a ceremony in Albany.

Good Neighbors Scholarship Introduced for Nearby Pennsylvania Students

The Good Neighbors Scholarship is available to residents in McKean, Warren, and Erie counties in PA and covers half the cost of out-of-state tuition to JCC. That means eligible full- or part-time students can attend JCC for the in-state rate.

Cattaraugus County Campus Alumni Association Gifts Toolkits to Graduating Manufacturing Students

Thanks to the Cattaraugus County Campus Alumni Association, 20 graduates in Welding Technology, Mechanical Technology Machine Tool, and Mechanical Technology Design were presented with important tools to help get them started on their post-JCC careers.



Graduates Celebrated During 75th Anniversary Commencement Ceremonies

Five keynote speakers collaborated to weave their stories of JCC's past and present into a reflection of the institution's long-standing core values during commencement ceremonies. Two of JCC's longest-serving employees, Marilyn Zagora and Nelson Garifi, along with current faculty members Jennifer Visbisky, Madison LaVallee, and Brent Harkness, addressed graduates, families, friends, faculty, and staff.

June 2025

JCC Joins Community College Reconnect Program that Empowers Adult Learners with Free Tuition

JCC announced its participation in SUNY Reconnect, a SUNY initiative designed to help adults ages 25 to 55 return to college tuition-free and complete associate degrees in high-demand fields. Eligible JCC programs include those in advanced manufacturing, computer technology, education, and health.

Residence Life Conference Brings College Representatives from Around the State to Jamestown Campus

JCC hosted the SUNY Residence Life and Housing Administrators conference. This is the first time a community college has solely hosted the summer conference that brings together representatives from SUNY

colleges across the state. The highlight of the conference was a diversity, equity, and inclusion discussion led by Ricardo Nazario y Colón, SUNY's senior vice chancellor for DEI and chief diversity officer.

JCC Earns Military Friendly Designations for 2025-2026

JCC continued its long-standing Military Friendly® distinction, earning a silver designation from Victory Media for the 2025-2026 academic year. JCC was also named a Military Spouse-Friendly School college for the second straight year.

July 2025

Cattaraugus County Campus Becomes Home for Regional eSports Tournament

The Cattaraugus County Campus eSports stadium continues to be a hub for regional high school and middle school competitions. Five schools in Cattaraugus and Allegany counties and more than 50 students ranging from sixth grade to seniors participated in the CA BOCES spring tournament at JCC's downtown Olean location.



Golf Classic Raises \$13K for Alumni Associations

The 33rd annual tournament was held at Holiday Valley's Double Black Diamond course. Proceeds from the event supported student scholarships and opportunities on JCC's Cattaraugus and Jamestown campuses. The tournament included 144 golfers and 36 teams.

August 2025

Sweden's U.S. Ambassador Visits Jamestown Campus

Urban Ahlin, Sweden's ambassador to the United States, visited JCC as part of a two-day stop in Chautauqua County. Urban, accompanied by

Congressman Nick Langworthy and Chautauqua County executive PJ Wendel, met with members of JCC's administration, including President Daniel DeMarte, and learned of the college's role in preserving and promoting cultural ties between the Jamestown community and Sweden.

Two Employees Earn 2024-25 Chancellor's Excellence Awards

Brent Harkness and Rachel O'Brian were named 2024-2025 recipients of the Chancellor's Awards for Excellence from the State University of New York. Harkness, an associate professor of Welding, was cited for excellence in teaching, and O'Brian, a Social Sciences adjunct instructor, for excellence in adjunct teaching.

Chancellor King Visits as Part of Reconnect Tour

During Chancellor John B. King's time on the Jamestown Campus, he toured the Veterans Student Lounge and Nursing program classrooms and labs and met with JCC leadership, faculty, and students. During the visit, King spotlighted JCC's Nursing associate degree program, which is eligible for the SUNY Reconnect program. King also highlighted JCC's day care center on the Cattaraugus County Campus in partnership with the Twin Tiers YMCA, which helps address essential childcare needs and is part of the college's efforts to ensure adult learners can focus on their coursework.
