Course Title: Crisis Intervention

Course Abbreviation and Number: HUS 1350

Credit Hours: 1

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will explore both the medical model and the social model of what it means to be “able-bodied” and “disabled,” and the benefits and disadvantages of those labels for the people who bear them. Students will also compare and contrast the concepts of ability and disability for people living around the globe and understand the work of social activists in the disability community. Finally, we will address the new possibilities that are emerging in the form of technologies and medications, and what that means for access and identity.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or Corequisite: ENG 1510 with supports.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Demonstrate understanding of the theories and practice involved in recognizing and intervening in crisis situations, including suicide and other crises.
 2. Identify and demonstrate understanding of a person centered, inclusive and culturally sensitive approach to practice.
 3. Demonstrate understanding of ethical practice, confidentiality and documentation standards.

 - Ensuring your own safety
 - The importance of cultural humility and person-centered care
