Course Title: Inter Black/White Photograph

Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2570

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students are offered additional experiences which are built on skills acquired in ART 1570. Extensive work in fine black and white photography, studio photography techniques, and experimental techniques is included. Designed to help students who have established basic skills and interest in photography to grow as student photographers in an atmosphere of advanced performance.

Prerequisite: ART 1570.
