# INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Biology of Insects

Course Abbreviation and Number: BIO 1540 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** This course studies insects, the most abundant and diverse group of animals on our planet. Students will learn about basic anatomy and physiology, evolutionary history, classification and identification, behavior, and ecological and economic importance. Field trips and a small insect collection are required. Outdoor fieldwork included.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or Corequisite: ENG 1510 with supports.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes:**

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Identify and compare insect morphologies to other animals.
- 2. Utilize scientific classification, organization, and taxonomic nomenclature.
- 3. Explain the principle of evolution and its application to the evolutionary history of insects.
- 4. Identify environmental influences on insect survival, reproduction, and evolutionary pathways and how environmental changes have impacted their ecological and economic importance.
- 5. Apply a basic knowledge of the evolution of insect behaviors.

- Insect collecting skills and techniques
