Course Title: The Modern Novel

Course Abbreviation and Number: ENG 2580

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will discuss and analyze some of the great novels in the period from 1900 to the present day. Students will learn to understand the novel as a separate genre and recognize the characteristics distinguishing the modern novel from earlier fiction.
