Course Title: Fundamental Skills of OTA II

Course Abbreviation and Number: OTA 1630

Credit Hours: 1 credit hour.

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will build upon the knowledge gained from OTA 1530 to further develop skills necessary for professional practice. More application and evaluation of the following skills will occur: application of the OT process, treatment planning, activity analysis, computer skills, assessment use and techniques, cultural sensitivity, and portfolio development.

Prerequisite: OTA 1530 with a grade of C or better.

1. Explain how socioculture, socioeconomic and diversity factors as well as lifestyle choices can impact the needs of our clients (B1.2).
 2. Assess vital signs to determine if a client is stable for intervention (B.3.7).
 3. Demonstrate basic skills with transfers and wheelchair management (B.4.13).
 4. Demonstrate awareness of principles of interprofessional team dynamic in order to best serve the diverse needs of clients (B.4.25).
 5. Assess range of motion utilizing a goniometer (B.4.4).
