Overview

SUNY and Jamestown Community College (JCC) continue to operate under the federal, state, and county public health guidelines. JCC plans to safely return in-person teaching and operations for Fall 2021 and will continue to offer online courses. The remainder of this plan will outline the Fall 2021 experience.

COVID-19 Vaccination

SUNY and JCC encourage all students, staff, and faculty to get vaccinated for COVID-19. SUNY policy will require all students accessing SUNY facilities in-person to receive a COVID-19 vaccination before the start of the fall 2021 semester, with limited exceptions. This requirement will take effect when at least one COVID-19 vaccination receives full FDA approval and reasonable availability to all students who request such a vaccine.

If a student is taking online coursework only and has no plans to participate in any on-campus activities or interactions, the COVID-19 vaccination is not required.

How to submit vaccination records

Students must review [Immunization Requirements](#) and submit proof of COVID-19 vaccination (including exemption requests).

How to get the COVID-19 vaccine

Students are highly encouraged to obtain the COVID-19 vaccine *before* coming to campus for the fall semester in anticipation of FDA vaccine approval. The COVID-19 vaccines are free and available through the Chautauqua County and Cattaraugus County health department clinics and many pharmacies.
