- Students who withdraw their registration from any or all classes shall be liable for payment of tuition and fees, and are eligible for refunds according to the following schedule:

	TUITION LIABILITY	REDUCTION OF TUITION CHARGES
Prior to the first day of classes	0%	100%
1st week of semester tuition and fee liability begins	25%	75%
2nd week of semester	50%	50%
3rd week of semester	75%	25%
4th week of semester and later	100%	0%

- Students participating in drop/add procedures during the first week of classes will not be assessed charges for dropped classes required for course schedule changes.
- Students who wish to withdraw from an individual course complete the Individual Course Withdrawal form on the [Registrar's Office webpage](#).
- Students who wish to withdraw from all their classes begin the process with the [Success Center](#). Students should consult with the financial aid and business offices *before* they stop attending classes or officially submit their withdrawal.
- All refunds are based on the date withdrawal forms are completed and filed with the registrar's office. Exceptions to this policy will be considered under extenuating circumstances.
- Students who receive Title IV aid (Pell, SEOG, Direct loans) and withdraw from all classes may have their awards reduced and will be responsible to repay any aid disbursed that they are subsequently ineligible to receive. Refunds are paid in the following order: Federal Direct Loans (subsidized and unsubsidized), PLUS Loans, Pell, SEOG Grants, required refunds of other federal, state, private, or institutional assistance, to the student.

In Person (on campus) - 000	Classes meet in person on the campus listed or other approved location.
Fully Online	
Asynchronous Online - 002	Classes are completed via Brightspace, the college's web-based learning management system, from any location that has internet access at times that you set for yourself. Students are expected to complete assignments by deadlines set by the instructor. You must be able to access the internet through a device equipped with speakers.
Hybrid (online & zoom) - 003	Class requires both asynchronous online learning and synchronous online meetings via Zoom or other resources. Specific meeting times for synchronous portions of classes are listed with each course.
Synchronous Online (zoom) - 001	Classes are completed live using Zoom or a similar web-based interactive video platform from any location that has internet access in real time according to a pre-set schedule. You must access the internet through a device that has both a camera and speakers. Specific meeting times for synchronous portions of classes are listed with each course.
Hybrid	
Hybrid (online & in person) - 004	Class requires both asynchronous online learning and in person meetings. Specific meeting times and locations for in-person portions of classes are listed with each course.
Hybrid (zoom & in person) - 005	Class requires both synchronous online meetings via zoom and in person meetings. Specific meeting times and locations are listed with each course.
Hyflex - 006	Combines online and face-to-face instruction simultaneously into one single course section. Students are able to participate in class in different ways: as a synchronous distance learner (via real-time, video streaming); as an asynchronous distance learner (accessing materials, recorded lectures, and responding at a later time); as a face-to-face learner (physically present in the classroom); or as a flexible learner (with a degree of choice as to how they participate each week; sometimes face-to-face, sometimes by streaming class sessions, etc.).
