# ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN JAMESTOWN COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND GANNON UNIVERSITY

#### OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

January 2019

### PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

This document establishes a transfer articulation agreement between Jamestown Community College (JCC) and Gannon University (Gannon). Its purpose is to afford students the opportunity to pre-plan their college careers, and to facilitate the transfer process from the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Occupational Therapy Assistant degree program at JCC to the Master of Science (MS) in Occupational Therapy degree program at Gannon.

### TRANSFER INFORMATION

- As noted in Appendix A, JCC AAS Occupational Therapy graduates must take these additional courses at JCC (or take Gannon-approved equivalent courses from another college) prior to admission to the MS Occupational Therapy degree program at Gannon:
  - CHE 1500 Introduction to Chemistry or CHE 1530 Allied Health Chemistry
  - PHY 1250 Technical Physics I or PHY 1510 Understanding Physics or PHY 1610 General Physics I or PHY 1710 Analytical Physics I
  - PSY 2510 Life Span Development

Failure to meet this requirement before the first fall semester at Gannon will delay entry into the MS Occupational Therapy degree program by one year.

- Students must have a minimum cumulative JCC grade point average (GPA) of 3.0.
  - As part of accepting the associate degree, Gannon accepts grades that have been deemed passing by JCC. Grades of D will be accepted as a component of an earned associate degree in accordance with this articulation agreement. Otherwise, a minimum grade C is required for course transfer. In addition, the Occupational Therapy Department at Gannon requires a minimum grade of C for the following courses to be accepted in transfer from JCC: BIO 2510, BIO 2520, CHE 1500 or 1530, MAT 1540, PSY 1510, PSY 2510, PSY 2560, and all OTA courses.
  - Students are encouraged to meet with an academic advisor at Gannon prior to their first semester there to discuss their transition and any particular issues relating to their desired program of study.
- Gannon will accept all 52-53 credits listed on the attached occupational therapy curriculum sheets (Appendices A-C) toward fulfillment of the requirements for the MS Occupational Therapy degree.

• Students are required to complete the following Liberal Studies Core courses:

- JCC Occupational Therapy Assistant graduates are not required to take Gannon's SOCI 120 Individual, Cultural, and Society.
- Students must meet Gannon's conduct standards in regards to known behavioral problems.
- GPA is used to make admissions decisions, but does not transfer. Course grades do not transfer, just the courses themselves.
- Because the number of spaces in the MS Occupational Therapy degree program is limited, JCC students who wish to transfer into that program will be divided into two categories:

Students who graduate from JCC with the AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant degree and a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0, and who also meet Gannon's conduct standards in regards to known behavioral problems, are guaranteed acceptance into the MS Occupational Therapy degree program at Gannon and are also guaranteed admittance (the opportunity to begin classes) to that program in the fall semester following their graduation from JCC. This guarantee is for a minimum of three JCC students per year. JCC will select those three students following the completion of their first year of Occupational Therapy Assistant coursework, and will communicate their names and contact information to the Gannon Occupational Therapy Department by September 15 of the year prior to their fall semester start date at Gannon. Gannon is committed to admit only those students whose names are received from JCC by September 15. Gannon may, at its sole discretion, choose to admit more than three JCC graduates to the Occupational Therapy degree program in any given year.

Students who graduate from JCC with the AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant degree and a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0, and who also meet Gannon's conduct standards in regards to known behavioral problems, but who are not guaranteed admittance in the fall semester following their graduation from JCC, can formally apply to Gannon and will be considered for admittance within the usual pool of applicants. Students in this category who apply to and are accepted by Gannon, either for the year immediately following graduation from JCC or for any subsequent start year at Gannon, will be afforded the same opportunities to transfer JCC coursework toward meeting Gannon degree requirements as students who transfer to Gannon immediately following graduation from JCC.

Students in both of the above categories must verify their intent to enroll by making a deposit in the amount stipulated by Gannon University no later than March 1 of the year in which they intend to begin coursework. Unclaimed seats will be offered to other qualified applicants.

JCC AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant graduates who transfer all courses from Appendix A and at least one course from Appendix C, maintain full-time enrollment of 15-18 credits each semester at Gannon, and earn minimum grades of C in Gannon courses will fulfill requirements for the Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in Health Sciences in four semesters and the MS degree in Occupational Therapy in an additional two semesters at Gannon, a total of six semesters to the MS degree.

AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant graduates from JCC will enter Gannon with full junior class status.

Students who are not able to complete all prerequisites prior to their desired semester of enrollment may still be considered for admission.

These courses can be taken at JCC to lighten the course load at Gannon (see Appendix C):

- ART 1500, 1550, 1560, 1570, or 1590 or MUS 1510 or 1680 to meet the GU LFIN Fine Arts Series requirement
- ENG 2560 or 2580 or 2650 to meet the GU LENG Literature Series requirement
- PHIL 1510 to meet the GU LPHI 131 Introduction to Philosophy requirement
