PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

International Studies Department, The College at Brockport

and

Jamestown Community College

I. INTRODUCTION AND OBJECTIVES

In compliance with the State University of New York's transfer policy, the document herewith has been drafted between Jamestown Community College and The College at Brockport's International Studies Department. The intent is to facilitate graduates of the Jamestown Community College Associate in Art (AA) Global Studies degree program transferring to The College at Brockport and adopting the Bachelor of Art (BA) International Studies major.

Please note that this agreement does not guarantee admission to The College at Brockport.

II. TRANSFER TO SUNY COLLEGE AT BROCKPORT

The number of hours to be transferred and the allocation of such hours shall be determined by the following policies:

A. Total Transfer Credit

1. From two-year colleges.

- a. Students holding an approved associate degree from a regionally accredited college may transfer up to 64 credits. Such students will automatically be granted at least 60 credits and junior status. Some students may need more than 60 additional credits to complete the baccalaureate degree requirements depending on previous courses and the major and other academic programs selected at The College at Brockport.
- b. Students without an associate degree from a regionally accredited college may transfer up to 64 credits and be granted junior status.
- c. Transfer students who alter their educational plans after acceptance by The College at Brockport should be aware that some students may need more than 60 additional credits to complete baccalaureate degree requirements, depending upon previous coursework and upon the major and other academic programs selected at The College at Brockport.
- **2.** From four-year colleges. A total of 90 credits may be accepted for transfer from any regionally accredited four-year college or university.

III. CONSIDERATION FOR TRANSFER TO THE INTERNATIONAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT

- A. To qualify for admission to the BA International Studies major at the College at Brockport, Jamestown Community College graduates must submit a successful application and official transcript to Brockport's Office of Undergraduate Admissions no later than May 1 for fall admission and November 1 for spring admission.
- B. Students who graduate with the AA Global Studies degree from JCC will be able to earn the BA International Studies degree in four full-time semesters at SUNY Brockport.
- C. A maximum of 18 transfer credits may be applied to the major's 36 credits of required core courses/required intermediate-level courses/required upper division courses. Only courses with grades of "C-" or better may be used toward the major.

1. SUNY General Education program

2. Brockport Local Graduation Requirements that can be completed at Jamestown Community College
