**Affiliation Agreement**

***Articulation Agreement  
Between  
SUNY Upstate Medical University College of Nursing  
And  
Jamestown Community College***

This AGREEMENT (“Agreement”), dated this 28<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2021 is made by and between the State University of New York, an educational corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, and having its principal place of business located at University Plaza, Albany, New York 12246, for and on behalf of the campus located at SUNY Upstate Medical University College of Nursing, 766 Irving Avenue, Syracuse, NY 13210 (“SUNY Upstate”) and Jamestown Community College (separately or together hereinafter “Party” or “Parties”).

Whereas, the Parties seek to offer to students who meet the specified criteria (as fully set forth in herein) admission to SUNY Upstate’s Nursing programs: and

Whereas, this Agreement establishes procedures to promote the easy transition of qualified students from Jamestown Community College to the upper-division program in the College of Nursing at SUNY Upstate.

Now, therefore, the Parties agree to the terms as follows:

**1. Objectives of this Agreement:**

- To promote the easy transition of qualified students from Jamestown Community College to the following upper-division program at SUNY Upstate:

**Online registered nurse (“RN”)-to-BS in Nursing  
Nursing, MS  
BS in Nursing to Doctor of Nursing Practice – Anticipated start Fall 2022  
Post Masters – Doctor of Nursing Practice**

- To provide specific information for students who wish to pursue a baccalaureate or master’s degree at SUNY Upstate Medical University.

- To attract qualified students to Jamestown Community College and SUNY Upstate Medical University.
- To encourage academic coordination and faculty/administrative interaction, including curricular exchanges between Jamestown Community College and SUNY Upstate Medical University.
- To exchange information on the success and failures of the transfer program.

## **2. Terms of the Agreement:**

Students from Jamestown Community College who are accepted by SUNY Upstate will be guaranteed full junior status upon transfer provided they have completed all prerequisite courses for their intended program of study as outlined in this Agreement and complied with the other requirements of this Agreement set forth within. Students accepted into the Online RN-to-BS in Nursing degree program can choose between options that require either two or three additional years with SUNY Upstate following completion of the JCC AAS Nursing degree.

- Completed courses with grades of “C” or better are acceptable for transfer credit
- All science courses must include a laboratory component.

Students who meet the pre-requisites and complete their program of study at SUNY Upstate will meet SUNY General Education Requirements.

Students admitted to SUNY Upstate pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the same non-academic pre-matriculation requirements that may be in place for students admitted through other channels including, but not limited to, successful completion of a background check and health clearance.

## **3. SUNY Upstate Application Process:**

### **a. Online RN-to-BS in Nursing**

- BS nursing offers spring and fall admission. BS applicants must submit the SUNY application and Upstate’s Supplemental Application:

- Upstate begins accepting applications for spring admission September 1<sup>st</sup>. This application closes November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Upstate begins accepting applications for fall admission September 1<sup>st</sup>. This application closes June 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **b. Nursing, MS**

- MS nursing programs offer fall admission. MS applicants must submit Upstate’s Application:

- Upstate begins accepting applications September 1st. The application closes April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Upstate will phase out of the MS applications after fall 2021 admissions when the program moves to a BS in Nursing to DNP.

**c. BS in Nursing to DNP – Anticipated start Fall 2022**

**d. Post Masters - DNP**

- DNP nursing offers spring and fall admission. DNP applicants must complete both Nursing CAS application and Upstate’s supplemental application.

- Upstate begins accepting applications for spring admission September 1<sup>st</sup>. This application closes November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Upstate begins accepting applications for fall admission September 1<sup>st</sup>. This application closes June 1<sup>st</sup>.

**4. *Admissions Course Requirements for Transfer To Upstate Medical University College of Nursing Undergraduate Program***

Applicants must achieve grades of “C” or higher for the prerequisite courses listed below. Higher grades are required for a competitive admission application. All prerequisites must be completed prior to matriculation.

**a. The following prerequisites are required for Online RN-to-BS in Nursing**

1. Degree - JCC AAS Nursing
